CONSIDER YOURSELF WARNED: this play includes firearms, strobe lights, profanity, kissing, and farcical violence. It also contains heaping doses of self-pity, failed relationships and obscure references to Kafka's life and works.

Lights, Camera, Mayhem! Welcome to *The Understudy* the first show of Hub's thirteenth season. From Theresa Rebeck, the acclaimed creator of *Smash*, comes a biting witty satire about Broadway dreams and backstage nightmares. When Harry, a hapless understudy, Roxanne, a frazzled stage manager and Jake, an up-and-coming Hollywood hunk collide in rehearsal for a newly discovered Kafka masterpiece, things quickly spiral out of control. As tempers flare, tensions rise and the stoned stage crew goes rogue, a routine run-through turns into a full-blown disaster. Will the show still go on? Get ready for misplaced props, oversized egos and lots of laughs in this show perfect for theatre lovers and haters alike!

What is an Understudy? An Understudy is a skilled and professionally trained actor who spends countless hours memorizing a part in a play in which she/he will never appear. It is an actor who attends rehearsals watching another actor play their part, knowing that they themselves may never get to play that role. Being an Understudy means always being ready to be of service. And it can also mean facing the terrifying moment the actor you are "covering" suddenly gets sick and with no warning, you're on, baby!

In my early 30's I understudied 12 plays at one of the larger theaters in town. I never learned so much at university as I did watching great artists in that rehearsal room; Maryann Plunkett, Estelle Parsons, and Roberta Maxwell to name three. I had several "close calls" and only one performance in all those years. — it's truly a thankless job and not for the faint of heart.

In our little play tonight, Theresa Rebeck explores the plight of one such creature, and delves wittily into the tribulations of a life in the theatre. We hope you enjoy this peak behind the curtain!
